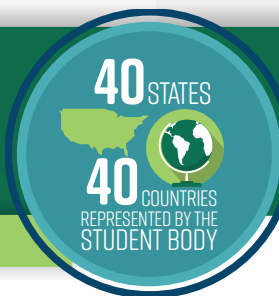

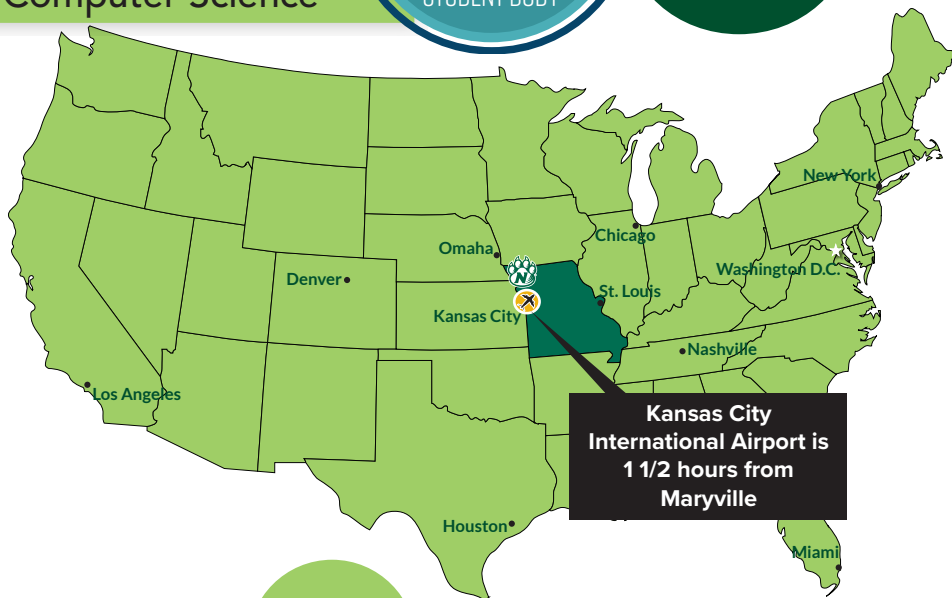

INTERNATIONAL GRADUATE ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIP FOR COMPUTER SCIENCE/ INFORMATION SYSTEMS STUDENTS

International students in the School of Computer Science and Information Systems are eligible to receive a \$500 scholarship toward the first semester tuition. The scholarship is a one-time award and is automatically applied on the first term bill. Students admitted conditionally are not eligible for this scholarship.

COSTS

Effective with the fall 2020 term, Northwest Missouri State University has no cost difference for in-state, out-of-state, or international students for graduate students in this program.
