INTERNATIONAL GRADUATE ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIP FOR COMPUTER SCIENCE/ INFORMATION SYSTEMS STUDENTS

International students in the School of Computer Science and Information Systems are eligible to receive a \$500 scholarship toward the first semester tuition. The scholarship is a one-time award and automatically applied on the first term bill. Students admitted conditionally are not eligible for this scholarship.
